

Azusa Rock Facts Azusa Residents Need to Know

In 2005, Vulcan Materials submitted an application to increase mining at Azusa Rock from 190 acres to 270 acres. After hearing from elected officials, community leaders and residents, that plan was withdrawn.

FACT: The proposed plan maintains mining at 190 acres at Azusa Rock - not one additional acre will be mined. This is not an expansion.

FACT: The proposed plan exchanges 80 acres of mining rights on the east side of the property for 80 acres of mining rights on the west side.
This is not an expansion.

FACT: The current plan permits mining at Azusa Rock until 2038. The proposed plan does not extend this mining deadline. This is not an expansion.

FACT: The proposed plan will, for the first time, limit blasting at Azusa Rock.
This is not an expansion.

FACT: The proposed plan mandates a reduction in production limits from 10.8 million tons per year down to 6 million tons per year. This is not an expansion.
